7. The Community Council will listen to patrons' concerns, but may not respond or take action during the meeting.

- Extra-Curricular Policy: students with drug, alcohol, or illegal behavior violations will now be granted one ten-day suspension from participation in games or performances for the first offense, then any subsequent violation will put them out for the rest of the season.
