I really tried to target this in their PCCRs with their parents this year and held their meetings a month and a half earlier than usual to encourage and support them in CE enrollment for Spring 2026. I also think that sometimes in 10th grade they aren't always ready/prepared for it developmentally. One thing that might also help CE enrollment in the younger grades (9-10) is if more of the SWTC/Voc Tech programs were open to younger grades.
